The Richardson Olmsted Complex South Lawn is a 9 acre distinctive gateway and a welcoming, innovative public space. It is part of the Core Project - the first phase of development as the Buffalo Architecture Center, a boutique hotel, and event and conference space, located in the Towers Administration Building and two adjacent former ward buildings. The design was completed by Andropogon Associates, internationally recognized for ecological landscape architecture.

The design reinvents the landscape and circulation as both contemporary and Olmstedian. By answering the question, “What would Olmsted do now?”, the design builds upon Olmsted’s original intent. The South Lawn signals the start of the redevelopment of this iconic site, creating a welcoming gathering place to have a picnic, take a walk, or enjoy an event.
